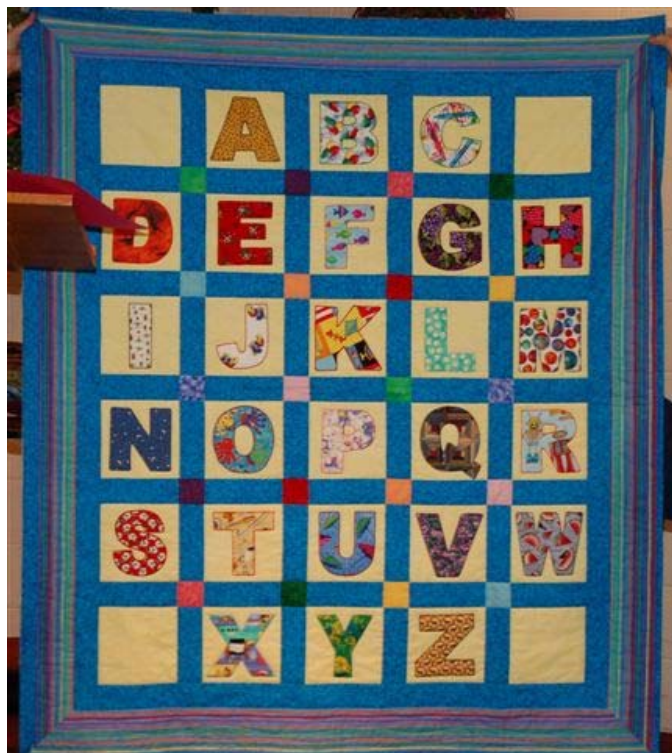
Prairie Pointer

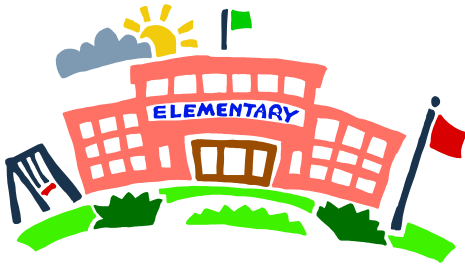

Friendship Quilts for Treasurer/Editor

Twila: 10½" block, unfinished, using a heart design (patchwork, appliqué, embroidery or whatever you do best) in pastel colors on a light or cream tone on tone fabric for background.

Jennie: 9½" block, unfinished, any pattern, using green, brown, gold and red colors that match a particular fabric (available at guild meetings).

Every Thursday from 11 am-3 pm a group meets at the Riley County Senior Center to sew, quilt and visit. Lunch is on your own.

Quilts From the Heart meets **every third Tuesday** at the Bernina Shoppe from 10am until 3pm.

KC Star Patterns Available by Internet

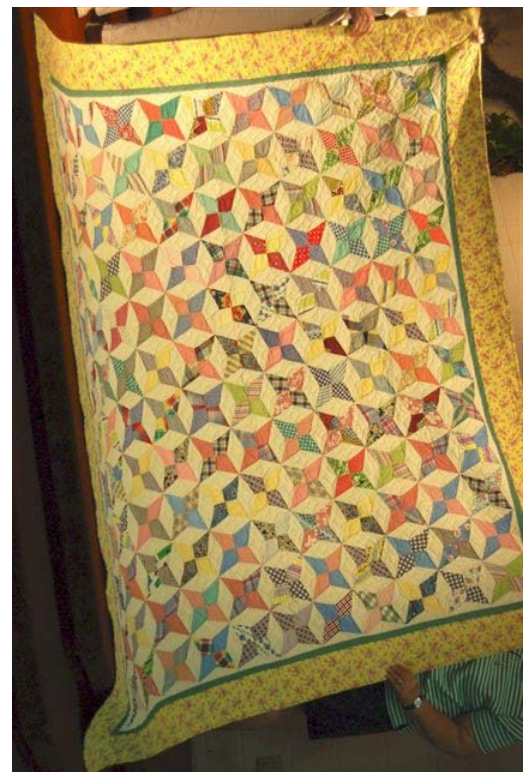

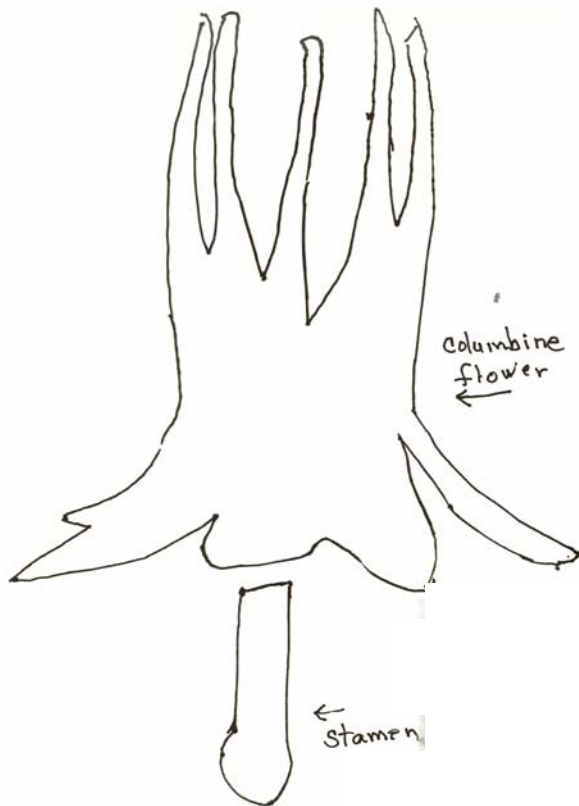


A scrap quilt shown by Bonnie Olsen, which will be raffled at the Clifton bazaar.

**October Block of the Month:
Erect Columbine**

*Aquilegia canadensis*L.
Ranunculaceae—Buttercup Family
Perennial
1-3 feet tall
Flowers April-May

- Stem: Erect, branching, hollow and cylindrical, glabrous to slightly hairy (especially on the upper portion).
- Leaves: Alternate and basal, pinnately 3-compound, on slender stalks; basal leaves in 3's; leaflets each 3-parted, ultimate segments triangular or wedge-shaped and shallowly or deeply lobed, glabrous to finely hairy, especially beneath; stem leaves similar, gradually reduced, on shorter stalks.
- Inflorescence: Solitary flower.
- Flower: Nodding, showy, 1-2 inches long from tips of stamens to the ends of the petal spurs, .6 to 1.75 inch wide; sepals 5, petal-like, dull rose or reddish, .25 to .75 inch long; petals 5, rose or purplish-red basally, yellowish above and inside, .4 to 1.4 inch long, alternating with sepals, lower portion prolonged upward into narrow, hollow spur, spur tip slightly enlarged; stamens numerous, conspicuously extending beyond corolla.
- Fruit: Pods, 5, erect, .6 to 1.2 inch long, each bearing a beak .1 to .4 inch long.

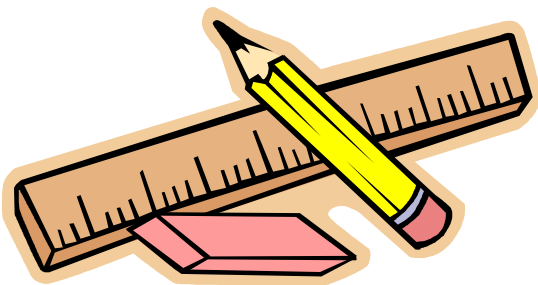

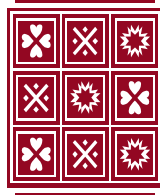
